and perform in front of an audience, especially including their parents! We have already had some fantastic trips out for our year 3 and 4 children, to the University and to the Beaney to support their curriculum learning. It has also been lovely to welcome in our new parents, both from Year 3 and those who are new to the school to get feedback on what has gone well and where they would like more information. We will now be hosting regular meet and greet sessions on our school gate on a Wednesday morning next term with some of our trustees. We would like to share our parent feedback from July 2023, when we asked parents to complete a survey to show where we need to address certain areas and celebrate where we are doing well. Over 120 parents filled in the survey, so thank you to those that did. 86% of parents felt their children did well at our school, with 81% of parents feeling positive about information shared in regards to the learning. 76 % of parents felt their child had a sense of belonging in the school and would recommend the school, whilst 94% of parents were very happy with clubs and activities on offer. Areas of development were around behaviour within the school, how this is managed and the negative impact of this on others, along with communication home between the school and parents and the use of Class Dojo. The Accelerated Reader program was also raised as something where parents needed more information. Our new behaviour policy has been shared along with its key messages and changes this term.

Wood work (Erwin) Being able to move one eye independently! (Andy)


What would you like to change in school? (This was discussed with children and trustees)









Seahorse Class have been learning about the food pyramid and why you should have a balanced diet.







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


Year 4 travelled to the University to observe and draw the beautiful landscape. The year group will return later on in the year to observe the differences that come with the changing seasons.

Can you work out where I was standing when I took these pictures? Try to stand in the same spot and describe everything you can see.













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
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
