



Welcome to Term 3 in Year 4

We hope that you have all had a fantastic Winter break, and are looking forward to the term ahead. Please spend some time reading our Curriculum Overview which outlines the main focus this term in each subject.

Reading

Quality reading time is built into each school day, but we do also encourage all children to read for at least 15 minutes a day at home, ideally sharing this reading with an adult. We have timetabled library slots each Tuesday so that children can change reading books, and we ask that they complete an AR quiz after each book where possible. Spelling

Children will be given a spelling list of 10 words each week on a Tuesday, which they should practise in preparation for a spelling test on the following Monday. Before we set these, we will have taught the words and practised them together in class. It is important that the children also practise these spellings at home throughout the week.

Times Tables

In year 4, the children are expected to work towards a recall of all times tables facts up to 12x12. We teach times tables regularly, within maths lessons and as a separate activity. Among other strategies, all children will use Times Tables Rockstars in school to support their learning, but please do encourage them to use this site to continue their practise at home.
