



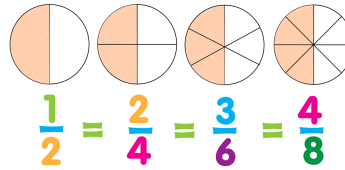
PSHE

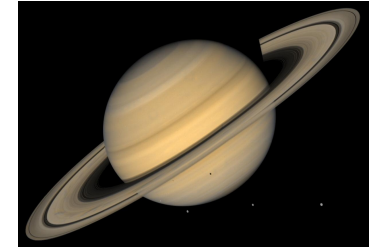
Maths

Our writing focus will be on narrative creation inspired by *One Small Step*, a short animated film which links to our space topic. We will also be writing narratives linked to the Victorian era.



RE

Our learning about **Christianity** this term will focus on concepts like charity, special places and the importance of forgiveness.



Art/DT

We will be continuing to look at landscapes, learning to review and evaluate our own work. We will then look at designing and building our own bridges!

Music

We will be listening to music inspired by space. We will listen to Holst’s Planets, and explore the compositions.
